RE: 205th Street Drainage Channel Project (Phase 2)
Early Notification Letter

Dear Property Owner:




Figure 1. Project Location

In 2009, the City of Lakeville, along with the Vermillion River Watershed Joint Powers Organization (VRWJPO), completed a project (Phase 1) to stabilize the drainage channel that discharges to Lake Marion. The project was located north of 205th Street, northwest of Jupiter Way and southeast of Kensington Way (Figure 1).

A field inspection of the drainage channel was completed in 2015 to survey the condition of the project and to evaluate the condition of the downstream drainage channel. The field inspection identified that the drainage channel downstream of Phase 1 is experiencing erosion following rain events and would benefit from similar stabilization improvements.

The City is currently in the design phase of a channel stabilization project that will tie into the Phase 1 drainage channel improvements and continue downstream. Phase 2 will stabilize the drainage channel using similar engineering methods and materials from Phase 1. The project is a joint partnership between the City of Lakeville and the VRWJPO.

Survey work is planned to start the week of October 10th and will continue throughout the fall. The field survey will collect data needed for project design. You will likely see field crews collecting information at various times through October and November. The City will schedule a neighborhood meeting in the future to provide residents an opportunity to ask questions about the proposed improvements.
