STAFF UPDATE

Streets Division

Staff has started fall street sweeping for leaves.

Environmental Resources Division

Landbridge Ecological planted replacement shrubs last week at the Casperson shoreline and Juno Trail stairway.

Public Works Department

Dakota County installed Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons last week at the Lake Marion Greenway pedestrian crossing, located on Dodd Boulevard just south of 207th Street West. The installation is part of a County-wide pedestrian crossing safety assessment designed to evaluate the effectiveness of best practices for pedestrian and bicycle safety.

Park Maintenance Division

Concrete pads were installed at Cedar Crossing Park for benches and a portable restroom. Paving of trails and the pickleball court were expected to begin this week.

Rink inspections began last week. Staff is checking warming houses, rink boards, lights, fencing and other items at each rink site to determine if any repairs are needed.
