Properly Dispose of Items During Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Day

The annual Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Day event is open to all Dakota County residents. A driver's license is required to drop items off.

Below are some of the items that will be accepted or not accepted. Most items are free to drop off, but note that fees will apply to some.

Household hazardous waste - FREE

- Aerosols
- Antifreeze
- Batteries (all types)
- Driveway sealer
- Fluorescent light bulbs/tubes
- Gasoline, fuels
- Household cleaners
- Lawn and garden products
- Oil and oil filters
- Paint (latex and oil)
- Paint strippers and thinners
- Pesticides
- Propane tanks/gas cylinders
- Thermometers
- Thermostats
- Varnish and stains
- Weed and insect killers
- Wood preservatives
- Most products labeled dangerous, flammable, combustible, poisonous or corrosive

Electronics (remove all batteries) - FREE

- Computer equipment
- Copiers (desktop only)
- DVD players
- Handheld game systems
- Hard drives

COUNCIL MEETING April 15, 2019

The City Council received over \$55,000 in donations to the Parks & Recreation Department, which includes \$50,000 from the Lakeville Baseball Association for lights at King Park.

A contract was approved for the 2019 miscellaneous roadway repair project, which also includes the installation of a residential organics drop-off facility at the Water Treatment Facility.

A conditional use permit was approved to allow for the expansion of The Moments of Lakeville memory care facility, adding 78,000 square feet and 60 memory care units to their existing building.

The Council approved a preliminary and final plat for Airlake Development Seventh Addition, which will include two lots east of Hamburg Avenue and south of Lakeville Boulevard.

A contract was approved for emergency repairs on Kenyon Avenue (north of 185th Street) where a sinkhole appeared.

Lakeville Art Festival: Call for Artists

Artists are invited to apply to Lakeville's annual juried art festival which is being held on September 21 and 22. The deadline for submitting applications is May 10, 2019.

This annual event gathers community and artists together on the historic grounds of the Lakeville Area Arts Center for a celebration of art, with an expected attendance of over 10,000.
