### Legal and Illegal Fireworks

Any fireworks that explode or are aerial are illegal in Minnesota. Examples of illegal fireworks include firecrackers of any size, ladyfingers, sky rockets, bottle rockets, roman candles, mortars, shells, chasers and parachutes. The only fireworks considered legal are novelty items such as sparklers, snakes, glow worms, smoke devices, noise makers, party poppers, string poppers, snappers and drop pops. NO fireworks are allowed on public property such as parks, trails, school grounds, government property and streets.



## COUNCIL MEETING June 17, 2019

The Council received an update on 2019 Pan-O-Prog festivities from POP President Greg Hagerty and other board members.

An ordinance was adopted eliminating the requirements for dog licenses in the City.

A final plat for the Spirit of Brandtjen Farm 21st Addition was approved and includes 43 attached townhomes and 52 detached townhome lots.

The Council approved the purchase of a new electronic sign for the Galaxie Liquor Store.

The Council held a public hearing and approved a new liquor license for Mizumi Sushi & Asian Bistro at 17629 Cedar Avenue.

A public hearing was held and the Council gave various approvals for Charthouse Senior Living, LLC. It will be an addition to Kingsley Shores, an existing senior living facility, and will connect by a second story skyway.

The Council approved a preliminary plat for North Creek, a subdivision including 80 single-family lots and 42 detached townhome lots south of 173rd Street and east of Pilot Knob Road.
