City Watering Ordinance Remains In Effect

Odd/even and time-of-day watering restrictions remain in effect through September 30. Water only on odd-numbered days if your house number ends in an odd number, or even-numbered days if your house number ends in an even number. Also, watering is only allowed before 11 a.m. or after 5 p.m.—watering during the heat of the day wastes water.

2020 Street Projects Progressing

Several street projects throughout Lakeville are continuing, including the 170th Street Improvement Project, 179th Street Reconstruction Project and the 2020 Street Reconstruction Project.

Here are updates on these street projects:

170th Street Improvement Project

The 170th Street Improvement Project is nearing completion. Crews have installed nearly a mile of new watermain, replaced curb and gutter, paved adjacent trails and performed maintenance on storm sewer structures. The base layer of pavement has been paved from Firestone Path to Pilot Knob Road. Crews are working on final watermain connections and utility improvements near the Flagstaff Avenue intersection. This project is scheduled to be completed by August 28.

179th Street Reconstruction Project

The City of Lakeville and Dakota County 179th Street Reconstruction Project is progressing on schedule. The new single lane roundabout at the intersection of 179th Street and Flagstaff Avenue will be completed and open to traffic on August 20. 179th Street will remain closed to traffic between the Crossroads at Lakeville driveway entrance and Flushing Hills Court until late October to complete the remainder



of the project. Additionally, 179th Street between Fieldcrest Avenue and Pilot Knob Road will be constructed and open to traffic by the end of November. This roadway is being constructed in conjunction with the Knob Hill of Lakeville development project.

2020 Street Reconstruction Project

This project will reconstruct 11 miles of road within the City including reclamation of existing pavement, installation of new pavement section, spot curb/gutter replacement, spot sidewalk replacement, water system enhancements, storm sewer improvements that meet storm water management best practices and pedestrian curb ramp reconstruction that meet current ADA requirements. Areas of this project are substantially complete, with many other areas scheduled to be completed soon. The estimated completion date for the entire project is October 2020.

COUNCIL MEETING August 3, 2020

The Lakeville Rotary presented an update on their plans for a modified 2020 Taste of Lakeville, which includes an online auction at tasteoflakeville.org.

The City Council approved the Preserve of Lakeville final plat of 49 single-family lots northeast of Kenwood Trail and south of 185th Street.

The Council accepted over \$31,000 in donations to the Parks & Recreation Department.

An amendment to the Small Business Emergency Grant Program was approved to expedite the disbursement of funds to eligible businesses.

The Council approved the purchase of several items, including replacement of HVAC rooftop units for City Hall, a new walk-in cooler for the Heritage liquor store and equipment for the Water Treatment Facility.
